As part of a select cell of law enforcement intelligence analysts, Doug created a recurring law enforcement intelligence product: "The Daily Report". This exhaustive report collated, maintained, and distributed, as a daily briefing, information including all topics related to police work both on the statewide and national levels. This document was widely circulated and read by Baltimore Police decision-makers, city leaders, federal agencies, and leaders in surrounding jurisdictions.

During his time as a Detective, he has provided critical Infrastructure support that included creating databases to track high-profile targets, persons of interest, gang members, and sex offender registry. He regularly conducts threat assessments for city businesses and houses of worship. As part of his assessments, he created extensive reports to report back his findings for each of these entities.

Doug has worked extensively with the citizens of the community and Baltimore businesses, non-profits, and faith-based organizations. He has been the foremost developer and presenter of Active Shooter training among several Law Enforcement Departments. He is a sought-after exercise facilitator as he safely guides participants in what to do, what to watch for (situational awareness) and how to minimize personal and material damage.

Before he became a Detective and police officer, Doug served in the Army National Guard as an Infantry Officer. He has served as an instructor at both the Baltimore City Police Academy and the Baltimore School Police Academy on topics related to both foreign and domestic terrorism.
