

Additionally, he is adjunct faculty for the National Emergency Training Center, Emergency Management Institute in Emmitsburg, MD, as well as the pro bono Director of Emergency Management of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul for the Archdiocese of Miami.

As a former CEO of an international aerospace company and now as an internationally recognized, multilingual lecturer on a variety of homeland security topics, Mr. Navarini brings humor, energy, and excitement to every one of his presentations, developed over forty years of business and operational emergency management experience.

Mr. Navarini was the first in the nation to graduate from all three levels of the National Emergency Management Academy (Basic, Advanced, and Executive). He was one of the first to translate the DHS/FEMA G-100, -200, and -300 courses into Spanish, in support of the PANAMAX Exercises, then successfully delivered the same in Panama, Colombia, and across the Caribbean.

As an Auxiliarist in the U.S. Coast Guard, he was part of the USCG Seventh District Joint Information Center during Operation Haiti Response in 2010 and was deployed overseas to the Republic of Panama during both the 2010 and 2011 U.S. Department of Defense PANAMAX exercises as a lead ICS instructor and exercise evaluator. He was also deployed to Antigua, West Indies, in a leadership capacity in support of USSOUTHCOM Operation TRADEWINDS-2011, as Interpreter Team Leader and staff ICS instructor.

Mr. Navarini is a retired Lt Colonel of the US Air Force Auxiliary (Civil Air Patrol) where he served in numerous command and staff positions. He was a rated aircrew member as well as Ground Team Leader, Air and Ground Radiological Monitor, CISM Team Leader, Mission Radio Operator, and Public Information Officer.

He currently serves as National Past President of the US Student Region of the International Association of Emergency Managers (IAEM) as well as an officer in the National Staff of the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and an Admissions Partner with the U.S. Coast Guard Academy
